Internet Connectivity Basics

What is Broadband?

Broadband is the transmission of a wide bandwidth of data over a high speed internet connection. Broadband provides high speed internet access via multiple types of technologies including DSL, cable, fiber optics, wireless, and satellite.

What is Bandwidth?

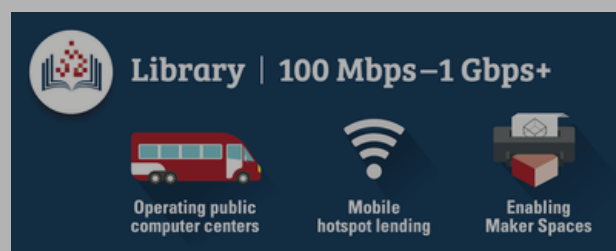
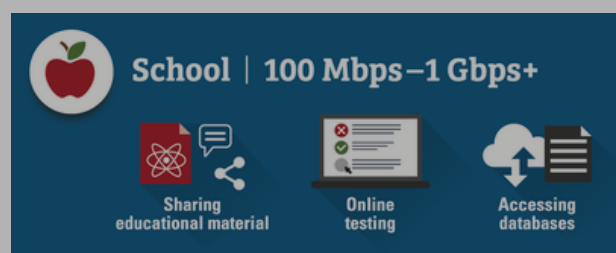
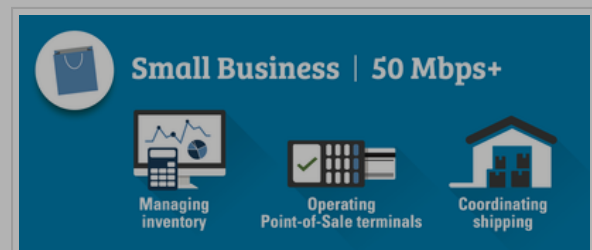
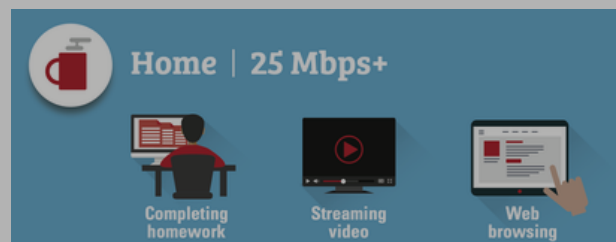
Bandwidth is the amount of data that can flow in a given amount of time.

Bandwidth is measured in:

- Kbps – Kilobits or thousands of bits per second.
- Mbps – Megabits or millions of bits per second.
- Gbps – Gigabits or billions of bits per second

FCC Standards

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) currently

recommends adequate Internet speeds to move data in megabits per second (Mbps):

- **Download:** 25 Mbps downstream
- **Upload:** 3 Mbps upstream
